The journeyman weavers of this metropolis, having foffer'd greatly of late for want of employment, and having petitioned the heads of that company to put the laws in execution, which prohibit the wear of all E. India filks, chints and printed callicoes, feveral advertifements dat d from weavers hall were published to remind the wearer, that the penalty for having apparel or furniture of Eaft India filk, or chints is 200 I. and forfeiture of the fame; 20 I. for felling or having India printed callico, and 5 I. for every day wearing such gown; and on this day published the following advertisement.

Weavers Hall, July 25, 1745.

Where eas several persons have within six months past bought gowns of printed callico, thro' inadvertency of the penalties incur'd by several acts of parliament for wearing them; the weavers company, Londow, give notice, that if such persons will apply to the draper that fold them, and he shall resule to return the money the gown cost, on applying to the said company's expence, oblige the seller to return the money for the same.
