
the stalks are fed from the table B between two fluted rollers, the lower one of which is journaled in fixed bearings, and the upper is yielding, being pressed down by spiral springs. On passing through the rollers the stalks are subjected to the action of a series of swinging beaters pivoted in eyebolts on the



drum D, which rotates at about 10 times the velocity of the rollers. The separated seeds drop through the slatted bottom G, and the bruised fiber is conveyed to an opening at the rear of the machine. See also SCUTCHER.

Scutching-ma-chine'. (Flax Manufacture.) Scutching is an operation succeeding that of breaking, and similar in its operation. Its effect is to still farther separate the woody portions from the fiber, the shives from the hare, by a beating operation, which makes short bends in the stalk, as it is crimped between the bars of the descending and stationary jaws.
