

Silk-Stretching Machine.

Silk-stretch'ing Ma-chine'. An apparatus for imparting the proper tension to silk fibers.

In the example, the ends of the fibers, recled on bobbins placed at the lower part of the frame, are moistened and attached to drums BB, whose motion unwinds them from the bobbins; when all is wound off on to the drums BB, the free ends of the fibers are similarly attached to the drums CC, which are set in motion, unwinding and stretching the fibers from the drums BB on to themselves. The final stretching is effected by the bobbins EE, which draw the silk from the drums CC and over a cries of rollers, one for each thread. Winding from the lower obbbins on to the lower drums, and from the upper drums on to the upper bobbins, may be effected simultaneously.
