Cloth-pa/per. Heavy paper used between folds of cloth, in the finishing-press.

Pick'ing Cloth. One of the finishing processes of cloth. It is subjected to a strong light, and all blemishes removed from its surface by tweezers. Spots which have escaped the action of the dye are touched with dye by a camel's-hair brush. Burling.

Snug'ging. The operation of rubbing down the fuzzy fibers of rope to improve its finish. Known also as slicking or finishing.

Tab'by-ing. Passing fabrics between engraved rollers to confer a wavy or watered appearance. Analogous to watering, or moiré. See Tabby.
