


PORTION OF A TAPESTRY BELT


DIAGRAMS OF PERUVIAN WEAVES

TAPESTRY FROM NAZCA IN WHICH ALL WEFTS INTERLOCK




DIAGRAM SHOWING INTERLOCKING WEFT
