Blue, (bloo,) n. [Fr. blsu; A.S. bleo, bleoh, bleow; O. Ger. blāw, līvid, sky-blue.] The color which the sky exhibits; a cerulean hue; one of the seven primary colors of the rays of light when refracted through a glass prism.
(Dyeing.) Blues are generally dyed with indigo, or with Prussian blue; in the latter case, the stuff is steeped successively in solutions of a salt of peroxid of iron and of ferrocyanide of potassium. Aniline blue is also much employed for silk and woollen fabrics. solved in sulphuric acid.—See Colors; Blue Carmine; Blue Ochre; Prussian Blue; Litmus; Blue Verditer; Indigo Blue; King's Blue; &c.
