Buck, (buk,) n. [Swed. and Goth. byka, to steep clothes in lye, and rub them with the hands; O. Fr. buquer, to strike, to thump, because clothes so steeped were also thumped.] An alkalide lye in which clothes are steeped or soaked in order to their being cleansed or whitened.

"Buck! I would I could wash myself of the buck."—Shaks.

—The clothes so steeped; a wash of clothes.

"O'late, not able to travel with her furred pack, she washes bucks here at home."—Shaks.

-v. a. To steep or wash clothes in lye.

"Here is a basket; he may creep in here, and throw foul linen upon him; as if it were going to bucking." — Shaks.
