Crape, n. [Fr. crêpe, for crespe; Lat. crispus, crisp.] (Manuf.) A thin stuff, loosely woven, of which the dress of the clergy is sometimes made: it is also used for mourning purposes. C. is made of raw silk, gummed and twisted on the mill, and woven without crossing. Crapes are either craped, that is, crisped, or smooth; they are all dyed raw.
