Dim'ity, n. [Gr. dis, double, from duo, two, and mitos, a thread of the warp; L. Lat. dimitum; It. dimito.] A kind of cotton cloth of a thick texture, and generally striped, or otherwise ornamented in the loom; it is chiefly used for articles of female dress, and for bed-furniture and window-curtains, and is very rarely dyed.
