The copy of Beebe used in scanning was rebound with a library binding. When
that was done, various odds and ends that had been inserted in the book were bound in. These include a hand-drawn diagram and clippings of various kinds of lace, apparently from old magazines. (There are advertisements typical of the early 1900s on their backs).
