
Shuttle Craft Guild HANDWEAVING

In January 1957 the Shuttle Craft Guild introduces a new monthly handweaving magazine which will replace the present Shuttle Craft BULLETIN. The new features are:

All features of the present BULLETIN will be retained, plus these new features, and handsome, substantial presentation which will make SHUTTLE CRAFT a basic reference file for now and the future. Like present BULLETINS, it will be issued in two editions: the standard edition at \$7.50 a year, and the Portfolio-edition illustrated with actual woven samples, at \$17.50 a year. You may subscribe for either edition.

The new SHUTTLE CRAFT introduces many changes. Starting in January the business manager will be Mr Boris Veren, well known to all weavers as the owner of the hand-weaver's finest book source, The Craft and Hobby Book Service. The official address of the Shuttle Craft Guild, starting January I, 1957 will be: Coast Route, Monterey, California. Through 1956 it remains Kelseyville, California.

The "Classified Directory of Services" will be an influential part of THE LOCM-SIDE MARKET section in the new SHUTTLE CRAFT. We expect this Directory to be an important means for weavers to learn of the "intimate" weaving services in their own vicinities, and in the places they visit, as well as of important mail-order sources.

There are many Shuttle Craft Guild members who have small, home or studio services, or mail-order businesses, which are part of the backbone of the weaving field. These include the instruction services which offer personal lessons, class or studio instruction -- so significant to the potential handweaver or the handweaver who is moving, but so difficult to learn about. You'd be amezed at the number of letter I receive asking if I can suggest an instructor in same particular part of the country. We do not know whom of our sbuscribers conduct such businesses for instruction, or sale of equipment or yarns. Therefore we must depend upon you to contact us if you would like to be listed in the SHUTTLE CRAFT Directory.

The charge for listing for three months, to be paid in advance, is \$10.50 for two 5-inch lines, \$15.00 for three 5-inch lines. For the first issue (and it is important that you be in the first issues if you have something important to offer) copy and payment must be in our hands by November 24. The deadline for listings in the TESTED AND RECOMMENDED section is November 15.
