INSERTION OF THE CHINESE LACE may be made

separately, as follows:

Cast on 14 sts. Ist row—k 2, fag, k 1, n, 0, k 3, fag, k 2. 2d row—k 2, fag, k 4, 0, n, fag, k 2. 3d row—k 2, fag, k 2, 0, n, k 2, fag, k 2. 4th row—k 2, fag, k 1, n, 0, k 3, fag, k 2. 5th row—k 2, fag, k 4, 0, n, fag, k 2. 6th row — k 2, fag, k 2, 0, n, k 2, fag, k 2. Repeat these 6 rows. While the 4th row is like the first row, it is knit in the opposite direction, and it requires 6 rows to complete the pattern.

Filet Knitting. General Directions. — Cast on three stitches for each block and each sp in the first




Fig. 34. Edging, Chinese Pattern. See page 14

row of the block pattern, then add one more stitch. Example. — A pattern beginning with 7 spaces, cast on seven times three, twenty-one plus one, twenty-

on seven times three, twenty-one plus one, twenty-two stitches. This provides for a single thread edge; if heavier edge is desired add two or four stitches to the above, dividing the number evenly at each

edge.

To Make a Block. — Knit three stitches plain. To Make a Space. — Throw thread over right needle twice, remove a stitch from left to right needle without knitting it (always insert needle from the front as if about to knit plain), remove a second stitch and bind off first stitch, remove third stitch from left to right needle and bind off second stitch; insert left needle in front of the stitch left from binding off and knit plain. This leaves, counting thread over twice, three stitches on right needle for that space. In knitting back, knit plain the first two of these stitches and purl the third (or second of the thread over stitches) as is usual in knitted lace when the thread is thrown over more than once.

In edgings, to increase, the last time up before the increase, at the end of the row cast on three stitches for every new space desired. To decrease, bind off

three stitches for every space.

In following a block pattern, follow pattern from




Fig. 33. Edging. See page 14 and Fig. 32

lower left-hand block up. Knit first row according to the pattern, knit back plain, purling in spaces according to directions. Knit up again exactly like first row and knit back again plain. It is necessary to repeat every row of a block pattern in order to square the blocks.

EXAMPLE. Ist and 3d rows — Same order of blocks and spaces as first row of pattern. 2d and 4th rows—Knit plain. 5th and 7th rows—Same order of blocks and spaces as 2d row of pattern. 6th and 8th rows—Knit plain.

Always begin a row up by knitting one stitch plain,

then proceed according to pattern.

Figure 35. Insertion in Filet Knitting. — No. 100 linen thread and two steel knitting-needles

Cast on 18 sts to make 5 spaces wide and 2 sts at each edge. To make a space (sp), thread over twice, slip and bind (without knitting) twice, knitting third stitch. Ist and 3d rows — k 2, 2 sp, k 3, 2 sp, k 1. 2d and 4th (and all even rows) — Knit back plain (except purl the 2d over). 5th and 7th, 9th and 11th, 13th and 15th rows — k 2, 1 sp, k 3, 1 sp, k 3, 1 sp, k 1. 17th and 19th rows—k 2, 2 sp, k 3, 2 sp, k 1. 21st and 23d rows—k 2, 1 sp, k 3, 1 sp, k 3, 1 sp, k 1. Repeat from 1st row after 24th row is knit plain.




Fig. 35. Insertion in Filet Knitting. See Fig. 35A and page 15




Fig. 36. Insertion in Filet Knitting See Fig. 36A and page 16




Fig. 37. Insertion in Filet Knitting See Fig. 37A and page 16




Fig. 38. Insertion in Filet Knitting See Fig. 38A and page 16




Fig. 38A. Pattern of Fig. 38




Fig. 39. Insertion in Filet Knitting. See Fig. 39A and page 16




Fig. 39A. Pattern of Fig. 39




FIG. 40. EDGING IN FILET KNITTING See Fig. 40A and page 16





Fig. 41A. Pattern of Fig. 41




Fig. 42. Wide Knitted Collar in Torchon Design. See page 17

Gather this edge quite full around the corner so that it will lie flat, and gather both crown and edge a little at the back.

CROWN. — Cast on 51 sts. Make 9 rows of squares exactly like those of the front, without scallops.

Knit this piece 9 squares long, then narrow off along

both edges until there are 13 rows of squares up the middle. Leave as many sts at the top, to bind off, as will make a good oval. Join the crown, also the neck, to the front, with narrow open Honiton braid and finish with ribbon bows and strings.

Figure 44. Baby's Bonnet. — One ball No. 100 crochet cotton, or linen thread No. 100 or 120, and two medium-size or rather coarse steel knitting-needles. If made of coarser thread or of knitting silk a larger cap will be produced.






Fig. 43. Baby's Knitted Bonnet. See page 19




Fig. 44. Baby's Knitted Bonnet. See page 19

Begin at the 19th row and repeat the last 12 rows until large enough for one-half of the cap, allow-

ing for the increasing number of sts at the back of the neck, "o, n," once or twice more in each succeeding row of eyelets in back of head. When large enough (in the model the 20th row of eyelets is the middle of cap) begin to decrease for the other side or half of cap by narrowing before putting thread over to make the row of eyelets at head of neck edging, and again after knitting the "o" loop (of same eyelets) in going back in the succeeding row, also narrow twice in succeeding row after making each large eyelet. Continue all other parts of the pattern as before un-til the second half of cap is completed like first half. Then bind off (on the odd row) all but 9 sts, and make 18 points of the narrow edge as at first. Sew the edging to the lower edges of front, up to the turned-over part, and turn the fancy edge of front back over the plain strip at the first row of open-work. Run a narrow ribbon around the neck, through the large eyelets, and draw to the measure required.




Fig. 45A. Detail of Front of FIG. 45

The best way to put these blocks together is to sew them in strips the length of the counterpane; the last side of the square sewed to the side of another star block that is opposite the square. Then one end of each strip will be a star and the other end a square. Placing the strips so they alternate, one beginning with a star and the next with a square, it will be seen that they fit nicely together for overcasting. (See diagram, Figure 49, page 23.)




Fig. 47. Block for Counterpane. See page 22 and Fig. 49

The outer edge may be left with the blocks forming a scallop, or a straight edge may be secured by knitting the wedge-shaped pieces as in Figure 47B.

To make the wedge-shaped piece, cast on 17 sts. Ist and all odd rows—Purl. 2d row—k I, (0, n) 7 times, 0, k I, 0, k I. 4th row — k I, (0, n) 8 times, 0, k I, 0, k I. 6th row—k I, (0, n) 9 times, 0, k I, 0, k I. 8th row—k I, (0, n) 10 times, 0, k I, 0, k I. 10th row—k I, (0, n) 11 times, 0, k I, 0, k I. 12th row — k I, (0, n) 12 times, 0, k I, 0, k I. 14th row—k I, (0, n) 13 times, 0, k I, 0, k I. 15th row—Purl.
