## IMPROVEMENT IN PREPARING JUTE TWINE.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 40,520, dated November 3, 1863.

To all whom it may concern:

invented a new and Improved Method of Finishing Jute Twine; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description thereof.

The sizing-matter is composed in the following proportions: of glue, ten pounds; of water, two gallons; of starch, one pound; of tallow, one-quarter of a pound; of china-clay, ten pounds, intermixed and boiled, and while warm applied to the twine.

The finishing is done by passing the twine Be it known that I, JAMES P. TRAVERS, of over heated pipes, friction-brushes, and hair the city, county, and State of New York, have ropes.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is-

The application of the above sizing and finishing to jute twines for the purpose of a substitute for cotton wrapping-twine.
