

DESIGN FOR A CARPET.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 19,208, dated July 16, 1889.

Application filed November 23, 1888. Serial No. 291,722. Term of patent 31/2 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, JOHN S. LAMOND and COLIN T. ROBERTSON, citizens of the United States, residing at Paterson, in the county of Passaic and State of New Jersey, have invented a new and original Design for Carpets, of which the following is a specification.

In the accompanying drawing is illustrated a piece of carpet embodying our design.

The design is a pattern, and it comprises a series of groups of figures lettered a and b, these groups of figures being arranged in the order shown. The group a comprises the three bars d e f, with a shorter bar n and o respectively outside of the interior longer bars

 $d\ e\ f$. The group b, however, comprises two long bars g and h, running transversely of the bars in groups a, with the short bar i outside of the longer bars $g\ h$, as shown. The pattern as thus shown secures a pleasing effect.

We claim-

The design for a carpet, as herein described, and shown in the accompanying drawing.
